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**WILD Education partnership renewed**

CWF President Larry Leigh and Environment Yukon Deputy Minister Kelvin Leary signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) focused on the CWF's WILD Education program. WILD Education is a conservation program delivered across Canada to youth in Grades K-12 by trained educators. The program's 'Project WILD' and 'Below Zero' activities foster environmental awareness through innovative, hands-on learning.

Environment Yukon has been training teachers since 1989 on how to deliver Project WILD, and has helped develop the Below Zero program. The MOU will ensure that this collaboration will continue and encourages partnering on future public education opportunities.

The signing of the MOU anticipates CWF's Rivers to Oceans Week (June 8-14) and featured student's music and poetry in celebration of water. World Oceans Day and Canadian Rivers Day help remind Canadians about the importance of taking good care of our water.
