**Conservation Education Intern (Summer 2018)
Shubenacadie, NS**

Offer of employment is conditional upon the Canadian Wildlife Federation receiving requested funding from Canada Summer Jobs, as well as confirmation of credentials

Anticipated start date: May 7, 2018

Wage: \$10.85 for 37.5 hours per week for 12 weeks.

Job responsibilities:

- Deliver conservation education programming to children and youth with the goal of inspiring a sense of wonder in the natural world.
- This will include programming with local partners, such as summer day or overnight camps, community organizations, such as museums or historic sites or as part of local community festivals, events and celebrations.
- The interns will also work with CWF staff to develop programming that is relevant to educators across Canada and will promote existing CWF programming

Supervision and mentoring plans:

The student will be supervised by a member of the education management team.

The student will have the opportunity to meet with senior managers and directors of CWF during their term to discuss future careers in conservation science, education or communication. The student will also be mentored in the inner workings of a large national charity. The student will receive training in natural pedagogy and conservation ethic.

The student will also work with experts across the conservation field in other organizations to get a sense of the width and breadth of the conservation sector. This may include land managers, federal, municipal and provincial leaders, education providers at like-minded organizations, etc.

Qualifications:

- Post-secondary education; **Field of Studies preferred:** education, natural sciences, environmental sciences or related
- Required to have Standard First Aid, CPR / AED;
- Access to a vehicle is required

To be eligible (Canada Summer Jobs position), students must:

- be between 15 and 30 years of age at the start of the employment;
- have been registered as full-time student in the previous academic year and intend to return to school on a full-time basis in the next academic year;
- be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act*, and,
- be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial/territorial legislation and regulations.
