WHAT TO DO IF YOU HOOK A TURTLE

Our turtles are in decline and need all the help they can get!

IF YOU HAVE HOOKED A TURTLE WHILE ANGLING:

- Reel it in slowly and gently to prevent the hook from digging in deeper.
- Never cut your line. A hook left embedded in a turtle can lead to its death.
- Use a net or grab the back of the turtle's shell to lift it out of the water. To prevent further injury, don't lift the turtle by the fishing line or tail.
- Be cautious as turtles may bite or scratch to protect themselves. Use extra caution with Snapping and Spiny Softshell Turtles as they have long necks and powerful bites.
- If the hook is difficult to remove, caught in its mouth, or is swallowed, medical care is required.
