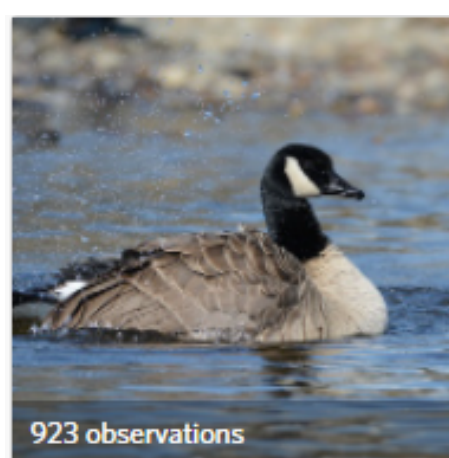
Nanaimo & Area

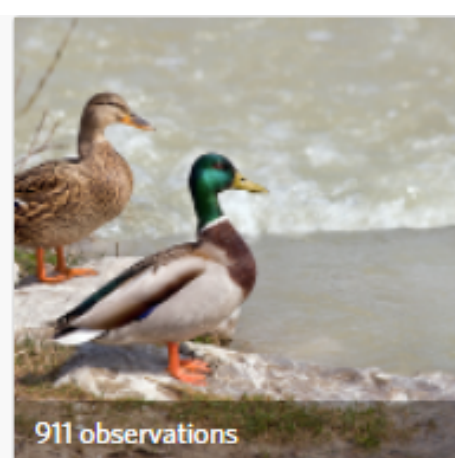
had the most participants per capita with 392.

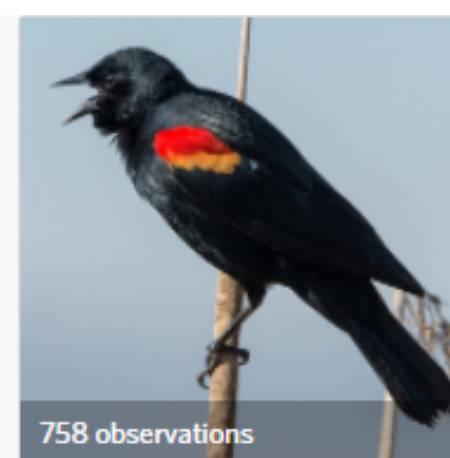

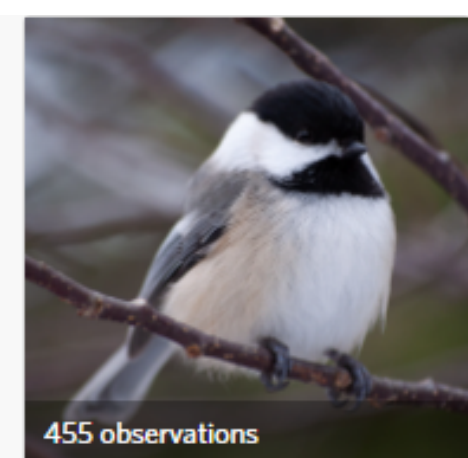
